From the Pastor's Desk



As I write this article, the snow is falling and the grip of winter is very strong across America. The Groundhog gave us no relief, the pandemic continues, vaccinations are rolling out slowly, and our worship services remain online. Lent began yesterday and our worship focus was on the cross and God's gift of His Son. The Bread and Wine of Holy Communion were a blessed reminder of God's sacrificial love.

Many years ago, the television show *M*A*S*H* featured a powerful episode where Hawkeye was on a bus with South Korean refugees.

The bus comes very close to some North Korean soldiers and, in order to avoid being discovered, the driver drives the bus off the road and hides it behind some bushes. They are still within earshot of the North Koreans, though, and Hawkeye directs a South Korean mother to keep her infant from crying. The crying ceases and the danger passes.

Later, when Hawkeye discovers that the mother has actually smothered the child so that the group of refugees will not be betrayed, it has a devastating impact on his mind and emotions. Hawkeye becomes emotionally distraught and needs treatment.

A mother sacrifices her child that others might live. That is almost more than you and I can bear to think about. I wonder if the cross still has such an impact on the modern Christian? A Father gives the life of His Son for humanity's salvation. Does that still move us?¹

I will let you ponder that question throughout the weeks of Lent. The cross is at the very center of our faith.

May you and all of your loved ones be blessed during this solemn journey.

CONFIRMATION CLASS UP-DATE - Rev. Frey



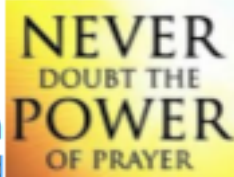

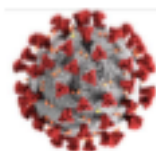

The purpose of this meeting was to begin formulating a plan for returning to in-person worship and activities. Various ideas were discussed and the committee will begin working on developing a plan. We realize that some are anxious to return to normal. However, the committee is tasked to do so in a way that is safe and responsible for all. CONSISTORY MEETING HIGHLIGHTS - January 12, 2021

CONSISTORY REORGANIZATION: The selection of consistory officers for the 2021 calendar year was the first order of business. After a discussion the following nominations were made and carried: Craig Conrad for President, Brian Ott for Vice President, and John Rizzo for Secretary.

PASTORS REPORT: December was filled with Sunday worship preparation, online Zoom worship preparation, and assorted meetings with staff and church leaders. Bible Study on Sunday morning is continuing via Zoom and Confirmation Class is progressing via Zoom. The average number of members and guests worshipping online via Zoom and YouTube has been increasing.

TREASURER'S REPORT: The report was reviewed and a motion was carried to accept the report as presented. Friedens UCC received full forgiveness for the \$30,300 PPP loan. There may be a second round of government PPP loan money available. It is not yet known if this will apply to non-profit organizations. Cindy and Craig Conrad will contact Tomkins VIST bank for more details.

NEW BUSINESS:

The 2021 budget was reviewed. It is based upon what we know and what we may expect due to COVID-19 restrictions. The budget will be presented for approval by the congregation at the January 17 congregational meeting.

A lengthy discussion was held regarding planning for Easter Sunday worship services. The early service may be an abbreviated service of a live video transmission from the cemetery. Plans are still under consideration. The late service will be conducted similar to the Christmas Eve service. Several consistory members are willing to fund the roughly \$2,000 cost to have the worship service professionally filmed and edited.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY:

Joe Bilski has successfully loaded the Financial Secretary software onto his computer. He will work with Ron and Naomi Klein to learn the Financial Secretary duties.

Ron Klein reported that there were 141 individuals/families that contributed to the church last year. Normally year-end financial statements are distributed at church. However, this year they will be mailed using bulk mail.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE: The contractor has not been able to paint the Parsonage windows. The Parsonage also incurred some water damage to the first floor ceiling, caused by an excess of splashed water that found its way to a gap between the wall and floor. The gap has been caulked. The Parsonage is a very old structure and will be in need of other repairs throughout the upcoming year.

OTHER BUSINESS: The COVID-19 restart committee will begin looking into creating a plan for safely reopening the church for indoor worship services and activities.

that the Friedens Mission Team receives a check for payment for your cartridges. Please remember that they only accept inkjet cartridges. Laser printer cartridges do not qualify.



ENVIRONMENTAL TIPS: Use the miracle cleaner...BAKING SODA!

- 1) Remove coffee and tea stains from mugs with 1 part baking soda and 2 parts water. Let sit overnight, scrub and rinse.
- 2) Remove odors from food containers. Rub paste of baking soda and water on inside of containers. Let sit for one or two days before washing. Repeat if necessary
- 3) Polish flatware with paste of 3 parts baking soda and 1 part water rubbed on with clean cloth. Rinse and dry.
- 4) Clean hairbrushes and combs by soaking in baking soda and water solution for 30 minutes or more, then rinse well in hot water. Squeaky clean!

The "Blue Zones" refer to areas of the world with concentrations of the world's longest-lived people, areas dubbed as "Blue Zones." Throughout this series we will delve into the lifestyles, habits and practices of some of these remarkable people of these zones.
