From the Pastor's Desk



I was reading the newspaper this morning and saw that Novak Djokovic, the great tennis player, was deported from Australia. He sought to play in the Australian Open and was barred from doing so, because he had not received the necessary COVID-19 vaccinations. He tried to fight the ruling, but was defeated in his bid to play tennis in Australia. The Australians have been working diligently to get their people vaccinated and keep their people healthy. Djokovic was extremely self-centered and I believe that he showed great disregard for the Australian people. He wasn't willing to make a tiny sacrifice for the needs of others. What a shame and his actions are disgraceful.

Like many actions taking place in the world, there is a lesson in this story for Christian men and women of faith. As we think about how Jesus would make himself known, I am moved to suggest that Jesus would show the world the way of sacrifice. Just as Jesus was baptized in the Jordan River by John the Baptist, I believe he would receive the two vaccinations and booster for Covid-19. Why? Because he loves all of us. He was and is filled with grace. The cross shows how much he loved us. He died on the cross for you and me. He died so that we might have life and eternal life.

In these chaotic times, a measuring stick, for all of us to use as we evaluate the actions of others, is simply this: "How much love and sacrifice do we see?" Are politicians in Washington, D.C. and Pennsylvania putting others before themselves? Do they risk party loyalty in order to best serve the voters? Are the local school boards sacrificing for the welfare of our children during the pandemic? Are Friedens Church leaders and members sacrificing for the needs of our church and all our members? Please ask yourself this question while you are praying. We need to look at ourselves instead of judging the actions of others. This is where Christian men and women approach the world a bit differently. We acknowledge God's grace and live sacrificially each day.

Where is Jesus today? He is standing with others as they prepare to get their vaccinations. He is hugging the nurses, aides, technicians and doctors who are serving the needy in overflowing Emergency Rooms. He is empowering the teacher



Rev. Dr. Tyson Frey began the meeting by reading a summary of a study on the state of churches during the pandemic followed by an opening prayer.

TREASURER'S REPORT: The report was reviewed. The church completed the 2021 financial year without having to use any money from savings. The government PPP loan was largely responsible for making up for the lower than expected member contributions. A motion was made and carried to accept the report as presented.

MISSION TEAM - Sue Henne & Shirley Riegel-Ferreri, Co-Chairs

Thank you to everyone who donated canned vegetables, hygiene items, and other food items to the Oley Valley Food Pantry in January. A total of 431 cans of vegetables (corn-105, green beans-173, peas-152, and mixed vegetables-1), one box of miscellaneous hygiene products, and two boxes of miscellaneous food items were delivered to the OVFP on January 15.



At the request of the Oley Valley Food Pantry, we were going to collect canned vegetables again during February. Due to a lack of availability on Helping Harvest's order forms, the OVFP has now asked us to collect the following items in February: peanut butter (40 ounce jar), jelly (30 ounce jar), tuna (5 or 10 ounce cans), and chicken (5, 10, or 12.5 ounce cans). Smaller size jars of peanut butter and jelly will also be accepted, as they said they will work with whatever is donated. One final request is that the peanut butter and jelly be in plastic, not glass jars. The Mission Team will continue Drive-Thru Drop-Off events in the church parking lot on Saturday, February 5 and Saturday, February 12, from 9 to 11 am. Donation items can also be brought to church on Sunday, February 6. The OVFP is still assembling 150 food boxes, so our goal will be to collect 150 of each requested item.

The Mission Team continues to collect cut coupons for our military stationed in Guam and used ink jet cartridges. These items can be dropped off at any of our Saturday Drive-Thru Drop-Off events or can be brought to church and put into the appropriate collection boxes located in either Narthex.

FEBRUARY FUN FACTS

February is the shortest month out of the year, so let's see what we can find out about it before it's over!

1. February is named after the purification ritual Februa, which was an early Roman spring cleaning festival.
2. In Old English, February was called "Solmonath" (mud month) or "kale-monath" (kale or cabbage month). The Welsh call February "y mis bach" which means "little month".
3. Of all the words you can misspell, February is one of the most misspelled words in the English language. Even the White House misprinted the word "February" in a press release!

4. Originally, February was made the last month of the calendar year. Eventually (c. 450 BC), February was moved to its place as the second month.
5. *Much Ado About Nothing* is the only Shakespeare play that mentions February.
6. Before Julius Caesar's calendar reform of 45BC, February was the only month with an even number of days. All the rest had 29 or 31.
7. February is the only month that can pass with no full moon.
8. In the Northern Hemisphere, February is the third month of winter. Meanwhile, in the Southern Hemisphere, February is the last month of summer.
9. February starts on the same day of the week as March and November in common years and August in leap years. It ends on the same day of the week as October in all years and January in common years only.
